Current Situation and Priorities

- Events Nova Scotia focuses on:
 - Keeping existing events healthy and assisting with pivoting/adapting
 - Investing in new event ideas that operate within current health guidelines
 - Communicate guidelines and build confidence

Current Situation with Events



Phase 5

- No gathering limits or physical distancing required for events hosted by a business or organization. Events can operate at 100% capacity.
- Proof of vaccination required.
- Masking still required for indoor events.
- Informal social gatherings <u>not</u> hosted by a business or organization up to 25 people indoors and up to 50 people outdoors without social distancing and masks.

Workplace COVID-19 Prevention Plan



- All not for-profit, for-profit businesses, organizations and professions are required as part of their ongoing operations, develop and comply with a Workplace COVID-19 Prevention Plan, as amended from time to time, and this Plan must address the following:
 - a) how to work and interact with customers or clients;
 - b) cleaning;
 - c) equipment;
 - d) preparing employees to return to work;
 - e) preparing for customers or clients; and
 - f) monitoring and communicating of plan.

Proof of vaccination



- It focuses on events and activities where people gather together and that are considered discretionary and non-essential. It applies to people who are 12 and older.
- Children who are 11 and younger and therefore unable to be vaccinated can attend events and activities with a fully vaccinated adult or on their own if feasible.
- There are grace periods for youth 12 and older to get vaccinated and there are exceptions for a limited number of circumstances.
- Proof of vaccination + valid gov't ID must be shown



VaxCheckNS

- QR code scanner app for use on a smartphone or other device to scan a paper or digital version of person's proof of vaccination.
- VaxCheckNS will be available as free download in the App Store for Apple devices and Google Play for other devices.
- Available starting October 22nd





User Journey: digital vaccination verification




Once the VaxCheckNS launches on October 22, organizations and venues will have the opportunity to freely download the app from the Apple and Google Play stores, and use this tool to simply scan the unique QR codes on vaccine certificates to verify their authenticity and quickly determine a person's vaccination status.



* NS Visitors or people with older versions of the Proof of vaccination form may still need to follow a manual verification process*









POV for Outdoor Events



- Events held in public spaces with <u>no specific entry point</u> are not subject to the proof of vaccination policy. (For example, there is no entry point to the Nocturne festival where people need to wander the streets to see the exhibits.)
- An event brings people into a single public space, such as a Remembrance Day service, with the intention of them staying in that space for the activity, a specific entry point can and should be set up wherever possible so that proof of vaccination can be required and checked.

Food and Beverage



- Stand up receptions with food and beverage are allowed. Masks still apply indoors, but can be removed when consuming F&B.
- With adequate measures in place, buffets, salad bars and other selfserve areas can operate.
- Recommend having staff members serve food from buffet lines to patrons, if possible.
- Food should always be provided by a licensed caterer.
- Potluck style events are not recommended. <u>https://www.novascotia.ca/nse/food-protection/docs/factsheet-cater.pdf</u>
